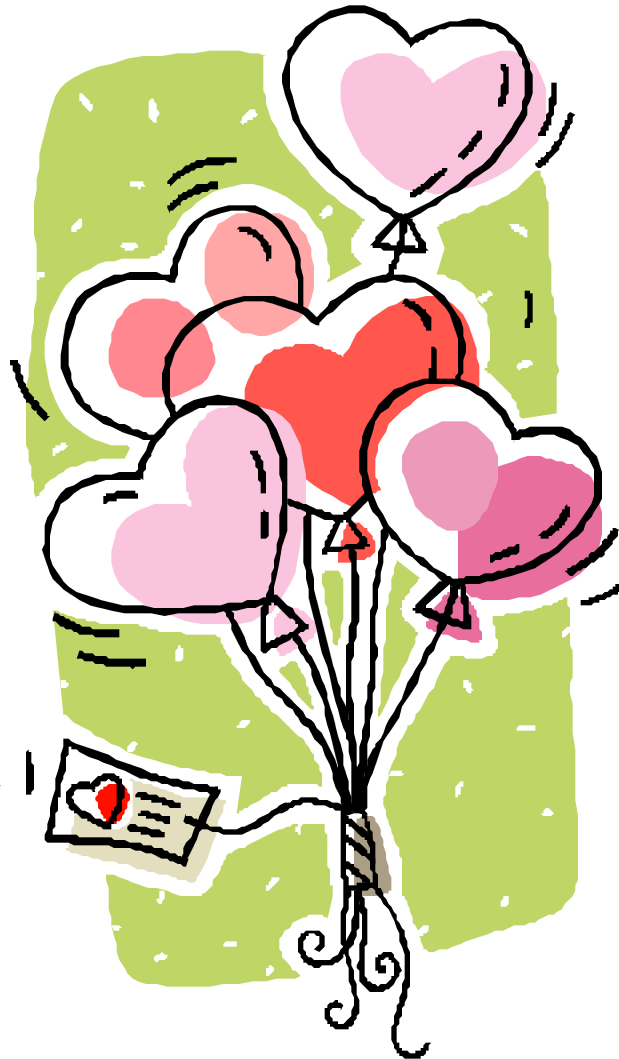

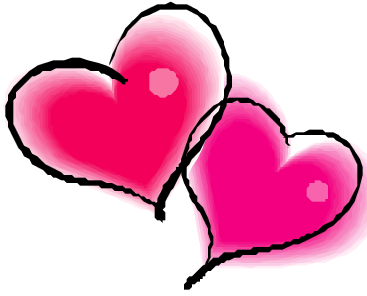

cost is \$1.

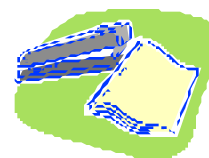


Resident Council Meeting

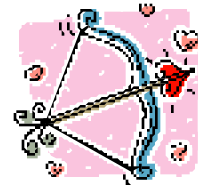


Ice Cream Social

BINGO — Join us every Saturday in February at 7:00. Be ready for a great time. The BINGO buck store will be on the 24th this month.

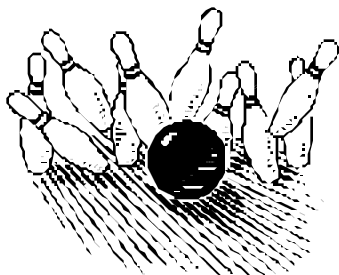


Napkin Ring Craft

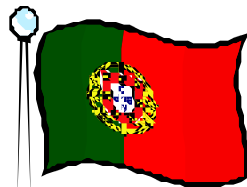
Valentine's Day Party

Why?

- It conserves our natural resources. Did you know that every ton of paper that is made from recycled materials saves 17 trees!
- It reduces the need for landfills and incineration.
- It protects and expands U.S. manufacturing jobs.

What?

- Cardboard (including cardboard boxes and brown grocery bags)
 - Glass
 - Plastic
- Cans (both steel and aluminum)

Where & How?

Drop your recyclables off in the appropriate bin in the NEW activity room.

It is important that you follow these simple steps to prepare your items for recycling:

- Cardboard — please flatten all your boxes
- Glass — Wash (with soap) and remove all lids
- ★ • Plastic — Wash (with soap) and remove all caps & rings
 - Cans — Wash (with soap)



Just see April if you have questions about where to put your items or how to prepare them.
